FY26-30 Program Summary • Approved June 2025 • \$4.3 billion of state/federal funding over five years • Continued focus on stewardship - \$3.8 billion • \$1.6 billion in bridge investments • Financial situation • Mostly flat revenue forecast • 4 of the 5 years are beyond the life of the Infrastructure Bill • Inflation moderating, but still significant influence • Impacts • Limited ability to add large new projects • Several projects had to be delayed due to funding limitations
